



Differentiated Service Delivery Improves HIV Care in Western Kenya



Differentiated service delivery (DSD) is a client-centered approach to HIV care and treatment that tailors clinical services to meet the needs of each client. This could include various creative solutions like multi-month dispensing, different clinics for different populations, and flexible operating hours. In the PACT Timiza program that recently completed, Ciheb in Kenya used DSD to support an estimated 90,000 people living with HIV.

In 2017, the Government of Kenya adopted a new policy rolling out pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) as part of a national HIV combination prevention strategy. Ciheb in

Kenya's PACT Endeleza program then aligned with the government and started offering PrEP that same year to the benefit of thousands of clients in Nairobi.
